The final concert this season is due to take place on June 8th and will consist of Haydn's Symphony no. 104 and Saint Columba of Jona, a cantata by Norman Nicholson with words by Iain Crichton Smith



Oban Bach Choir and Orchestra are preparing to give the second of their three spring concerts in this their 50th season, on Saturday May 11th, at 7.30 in the Cathedral.

Whereas the first concert was fairly subdued, falling in Lent, this one is much more celebratory in character, beginning with Handel's Fireworks Music, written in 1749 as part of the celebrations of the Peace of Aix-la-Chapelle.

The two motets by Gabrieli were composed for performance in the magnificent setting of St. Mark's, Venice, where the performers would split into groups spaced out in different galleries. This, of course, is not possible here in St John's, though the sound of 'Exultet jam angelica' (Let the angelic choirs of heaven now rejoice) should still be impressive with its harmony in no fewer than 14 parts.

'Lift up your heads, O ye gates' from Handel's Messiah, is a suitable choice for Ascensiontide, and also included are 'I will give thanks' by Muller (formerly attributed to Mozart) and 'Gratias agimus
