

CANDLEMAS ~ Malcolm Guite

They came, as called, according to the Law. Though they were poor and had to keep things simple,

They moved in grace, in quietness, in awe,
For God was coming with them to His temple.
Amidst the outer court's commercial bustle
They'd waited hours, enduring shouts and shoves,
Buyers and sellers, sensing one more hustle,
Had made a killing on the two young doves.
They come at last with us to Candlemas
And keep the day the prophecies came true
We glimpse with them, amidst our busyness,
The peace that Simeon and Anna knew.
For Candlemas still keeps His kindled light,
Against the dark our Saviour's face is bright.



The celebrations that began at Christmas have continued through the successive Sundays of Epiphany, and now the focus ends with **the Feast of the Presentation.** The child who has been manifested to the magi at his birth is now recognized by Simeon and Anna, when he comes to be presented in the Temple according to the Law of Israel. He is both 'a light to lighten the Gentiles' and 'the glory of God's people Israel'. But the redemption will be won through suffering and so the day marks a pivotal moment when the eyes on the Incarnation are directed towards the Passion; and Simeon's final words move our attention away from the celebration of Christ's Birth and towards the mysteries of Lent and Easter.

The tradition of **Candlemas** derives from the practice of lighting and blessing candles during the church service on this day. Some think that this goes back to at least the 7th century *Alcuin* (*c*.735-804) refers in one of his homilies to a Candlemas procession: "the whole multitude of the city collecting together . . . bearing a vast number of wax lights, and no one enters any public place in the city without a taper in his hand. These candles symbolize the light of Christ, dispelling the darkness both literally and spiritually. Traditionally, all the candles to be used in the church in the coming year were blessed, together with candles to be used in worshippers homes.

We continue this celebration through our readings and, with candles given to all present to take home and use, as we continue to reflect on what Christ incarnate means in our lives.

Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace according to thy word.



VESTRY MEETING


The Vestry for the Cathedral is meeting this week to consider, amongst other practicalities, the ongoing trouble we have experienced in moving works forward. This has been outwith our control as we have waited for professional reports/ actions. We remain poised to access church permissions (Canon 35's from the Diocesan Building Committee) for the Chairlift, but have been delayed by details needed from the structural engineer in order to obtain a Building Warrant before being able to submit our Canon 35 application. We now have these drawings (after many, many months of chasing)) and these will be discussed by the Vestry. We will inform you of the next steps. Please talk to Ken Oxland if you would like more details. This will also include the installation of a concrete slope from the pavement to make access more accessible.

We are poised to receive details of 6 new wall/ girder mounted electrical heaters for the Cathedral which will give 12kw of additional heating without the need for an additional electrical phase which will save both time and money. Canon 35 will be submitted following our meeting to agree this way forward.

We will also be purchasing an altar for the Nave position, the design being the most popular on our consultation. The Canon 35 will be applied for and votes/ comments from the Consultation will be available to the Building Committee.

Any comments on these, please do ensure that they are passed to Margaret Sime before our meeting on Wednesday.
