O Morning Star,

splendour of light eternal and sun of righteousness: Come and enlighten those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

Jesus, as our morning star brings light, clarity, warmth, healing....the renewal of a new dawn and day. All that seemed to pervade in the darkness is overcome.

This Light brings us to a time when there is no more darkness.

Do we live each day with this light in our lives—our hearts—our minds? Do we pray constantly for the light to break through in our homes, our community, our nations, the world....

### Our Sixth Antiphon reflects

## O King of the nations,

and their desire, the cornerstone making both one: Come and save the human race, which you fashioned from clay.

Humanity is good at dividing, drawing lines, treating 'otherness' as a threat or even sin. The King of the Nations is about drawing us all into one around Him and removing all that blinkers us or hardens our hearts towards each other. The lion shall lie with the lamb ... and the little child shall lead them....


