

FOCUS ON: The Eagle

The imposing bronze eagle sculpture is situated on the wall of what would have been the archway to a second transept. Sculped by George Wyllie of Gourock, the eagle links to our Cathedral dedication to St John the Divine. John's Gospel, which describes Jesus as the Divine Word—with the eagle a symbol of that which comes from above.

It also references the Revelation of John—where the eagle sees what is beyond our immediate vision. Take a moment to look up at the amazing detail on this glorious sculpture.

ST JOHN'S ORGAN NEWS...

THE 'ORGAN'ISERS



The Vestry are looking to purchase a REPLACEMENT ELECTRONIC ORGAN asap, ensuring that it meets the same, or better, impressive specification to which we are used, has a good life expectancy and ongoing maintenance/ parts availability. The Vestry have asked the Provost, James and George to investigate potential options, in conversation with others in the Cathedral....

Although a new organ will be outwith our price capacity—we are:

- looking at ex-demo or organs being sold through organ building companies, which are refurbished before sale, installed professionally and with after-sales care/ maintenance and warranty.
- We are also making enquiries about the potential of a rebuild within the existing organ console.
- We have narrowed down preferred companies through style, tone and sound expectation (what you expect to hear in a British Cathedral as opposed to continental sounds).

We are, sadly, unlikely to consider organs from redundant churches as these have no provenance, their state will be unknown, they will not have professional installers (which are needed) be refurbished, have warranties or electrical guarantee).

We are making use of our organists' experience of a variety of instruments and their knowledge of the required specification to suit our Cathedral space.

Price is obviously a factor with the final choice being put to Vestry—when cost, specification, warranty and longevity all come together.

Just to note also, there are very few ex demo or second-hand organs on the market, thus we will be poised to make decisions if the right one is found, or if we choose to rebuild. We will keep you updated with news.

THE FUNDRAISERS

An excellent meeting was held last Monday, thank you so much to all who came along and those who offered ideas in absentia. These are listed below.

As important were the offers to take a lead on events and actions, this is something that will require many people to assist to ensure that we meet our target.

At the moment, without a decision on a specific replacement organ or rebuild—we are making an educated (from those seen) estimates of between £30,000 to £60,000.

- We are looking to produce fundraising leaflets etc as soon as viably possible to begin the campaign and raise public awareness...
- We are looking for people to volunteer to run events—small or large—each will help us reach our total....
- We will decide on a Launch Date asap and bring out a Calendar of Events...
- We are already receiving Donations and the information leaflet will contains means to donate.

Please do consider GIFT AID on any funds raised or donations... it will bring in an extra 25% on any total, although do check that you are eligible/ not exceeded your gift aid allowance.

THE FUND

Thank you so much to those who have already donated to the fund—a wonderful £2000+ has started us off incredibly well and is very encouraging.
