The General Synod of the Scottish Episcopal Church 2025

Two things struck me profoundly at Synod this year....the challenge and depth of discussions which filled our days, and the truly Christian respect and love within which all were held. If a few moments nudged us towards anything less, the overall feel of the room brought us back.

Synod began with a celebration of the Eucharist, with a Diocesan Bishops present there was a lightness within the unity as the Primus gave his Charge, pointing to the need for building relationships and healing broken ones. With 'housekeeping matters ' and procedures sorted, I was privileged to Chair the 2nd Session which first covered the Investment portfolios - which are positive—and the work of the ethical advisory committee in ensuring all our finances meet our moral and ethical requirements—very reassuring. Following that we heard a presentation from the College of Bishops and Standing Committee as they set aside £10m to fund mission projects and look to enable the hopes and dreams of Charges and Dioceses. *PS your Vestry has also filled in a questionnaire on this.*

Over the following days we discussed Canons (our laws) and had a presentation on how upcoming changes in Scottish law affects the roles and duties of Trustees, which was eloquently shared. Our Vestry will be working through these changes. We were given a fascinating insight into the cultural and theological context of the development of the Nicene Creed. Hearing the history of the Council of Nicaea in the year of its 1700th anniversary, reminded us of the context in which it was written...the struggles and growing heresies which concerned the early church and saw doctrine discussed and laws set in place. So much has changed and yet we continue to debate the voice of God into the world today, how we can share and learn from others — where societal values challenge or enhance faith. This was followed by an inspiring report on the work of the Mission Board by its outgoing Chair, before we reflected on the work to be done on the legacy of the slave trade. What could have been dry, was engaging and hugely impactful on our daily Episcopal life and worship. The last session was a powerful testament to friendship, as we overwhelmingly welcomed the St Ninians Declaration of friendship between our Province and the Catholic Church....a time of hope and positivity. The Declaration was welcomed by Archbishop Leo Cushley *"I value friendship deeply. It is only through friendship that we will come to trust each other, it is only by trusting each other that we will learn from each other, and it is only be learning from each other that we will take this forward, and the great project that Our Lord prayed for the night before he died will come again to pass, here in the Christian West.*

Our young people were with us and shared their hopes and joys, sorrows and fears for the future. Speaking of the experiences of their generation, they reminded us of their concerns for climate Change, nuclear proliferation as well as a powerful testimony from one, representing many more, who amidst all the voices in society, kind and unkind about how they identify, feels safe in SEC churches. They asked us to remember their story, their feelings, their place as God's beloved children, as we entered our debate on the final day about gender. Our inspirational young people encouraged and challenged us and it was good to hear and support them. Without doubt the debates on the last day went deep as we reflected on end of life care and assisted suicide; mainly how we step aside from our own thoughts – to hear those of others and treat their wishes with respect. Swiftly following was the discussion on our trans + siblings, which focused around – does God truly love all? If so – then we must do likewise. A deep, thoughtful, honouring and sensitive conversation where Synod overwhelmingly affirmed ' all means all', choosing to make our churches safe and welcoming. Much to prayerfully share and reflect on. An inspired Synod. More in depth reports can be found on the Provincial website and facebook pages....
