



VESTRY UPDATE Amongst other discussions

HEATING—the additional heaters have received Canon 35 permission and the units arrived . We hope that they will be installed very soon! ALARM SYSTEM—due to age, much of the system has had to be replaced. The new control panel will be installed soon and hopefully end the faulty alerts happening during worship and concerts.

ALTAR—this has been ordered following Canon 35 permission and should arrive before Christmas.

The HEATING BOILER in the hall has been repaired.

CHAIRLIFT—the engineers are returning and we hope that the final flaws in the operation to allow battery powered wheelchairs to use it will be sorted.

FINANCE—we are in desperate need of assistance with the day to day work—cheques, banking, updating the vestry on financial status. If you could help, please speak to Provost Margi. AGM—the date has been set for Jan 18th
